

Official Nordic co-operation is channelled through two organisations: the Nordic Council and the Nordic Council of Ministers.



- The Nordic Council was formed in 1952 and is the forum for Nordic parliamentary co-operation. The Council has 87 chosen members, representing the five countries and three autonomous territories.
- The Nordic governments have collaborated in the Nordic Council of Ministers since 1971.

19.6.2007 - Nordic premiers meet at Punkaharju to promote more skilled, visible and thriving Nordic region

Nordic premiers held their summer meeting on 18 and 19 June at Punkaharju. The premiers shared a positive attitude towards the opportunities and challenges of globalisation for the Nordic countries.



They want to utilise these opportunities and meet the challenges by developing further the Nordic model, the fundamental parts of which are citizens' future welfare, competitiveness of enterprises, employment and economic growth, as well as a common culture and investment in sustainable development.

The premiers also want develop the strengths of the Nordic countries, the high-standard and extensive education system, expertise and research work, the ability to utilise information technology, as well as creative implementation of innovations.

Therefore, the premiers agreed to launch a new Nordic endeavour in globalisation. The synergy benefits of the work carried out at the European and regional level will be utilised in the implementation. More profound co-operation with the Baltic countries reinforces the competitiveness of the entire Baltic Sea region and increases opportunities to utilise globalisation.

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


While many of the necessary changes have to happen at the local, national, or EU level, regional collaboration among the Nordic countries can be significant in a number of areas:

- Deeper regional market integration is critical to overcome the multiple costs of the small national markets;
- **global excellence in science** is easier to achieve in a regional context;
- human capital attraction is more effective if global talent gains simple access to the entire region;
- **cluster development** can become more effective through stronger regional competition and collaboration among clusters;
- articulating the specific value the Nordic region offers to businesses can support the positioning of individual regions; and
- a consensus on key elements of globalization at the Nordic level can contribute to more effective national policy debates.



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


Green growth






Today: 27 projects – 700 MNOK (90 MEUR)

- Etablering av 10 tematiska nätverk som samlar mer än 100 nordiska universitet, institution, myndigheter och företag, 6 helt nya Nordic Centers of Excellence inom klimatområdet som samlar cirka 100 partners från samtliga arktiska länder, samt genom att det har igångsatts 12 tematiska integrerande projekt där industri, akademi och myndighet samverkar
- Medverkan från industrin i delprogrammen kring vind, bioenergi och nanoteknologi ligger på mellan 25-50 %
- Exempel: I nanoprogrammet deltar 69 procent från industrin och 39 procent från forskningsinstitutioner. TFI investerar ca 50 MNOK i programmet som har en samlad volym på ca 120 MNOK.




<u>Guidelines for the Nordic Council of Ministers' co-operation with</u> <u>Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania 2009–2013</u>

- The environment, climate and energy (including environmental conditions in the Baltic Sea and the promotion of effective environmental technologies and sustainable sources of energy, where

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



Financial mechanisms



Fundamentally, the Nordic-Baltic co-operation is a partnership on an equal footing, and each party covers its own costs. In special cases, the parties may collectively agree a different method of meeting costs, e.g. joint mobility schemes funded according to relative GDP














Proposal for eScience as a globalization initiative



A baltic sea knowledge infrastructure for the fifth freedom

Summary: background and process



- Discussions since 2006 about Baltic Ring, collaboration on Nordunet 3 since 2007.
- Secretary general launch "Knowledge for the 5th freedom in the Baltic Sea Area" concept on BDF Summit 2008.
- 2008-2009 NCM conducts a feasibiltiy study on "Knowledge infrastructure for the Fifth Freedom in the Baltic Sea Area."

Recommendations:

- (1) Establish a fiber ring network through the countries around the Baltick Sea.
- (2) Establish a joint coordinator (light weight)
- 2009-2010 "Consultation on feasibility study"
- 2010-2011 "Technicial follow-up study on Baltic Ring"
- November 2010. NMR-U supported by the ministers from Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania - agrees to invite Russia, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, Germany to a meeting on Senior offical or expert level to discuss if and how to make the realize the initiative, starting with the Baltic Ring.




