
NORDUnet

NORDUnet Vision and Strategy


- It is the Vision of NORDUnet to be the:

The European Vision




- "GÉANT 2020" is the European communications commons

European Spallation Source


Materials research facility using the neutron scattering technique
















Baltic Ring




Joint Baltic Ring






Baltic NREN Summary






Baltic Ring Topology Proposal

- Workshop for officials and senior R&E network staff


Action Points Agreed in Riga

- At political level, progress MoU
 - To be presented early spring, agreed before summer
 - NCM to set up process, initiate MoU
 - Countries to nominate a working group
 - NCM to present process for decision at NB senior officials meeting
- Expert group to progress items for Consortium Agreement
 - NRENs to nominate a working group
 - NORDUnet to arrange meeting for NREN experts in January to initiate process, establish willingness and timetable
 - NRENs to come to consensus on technology, operations, cost-sharing models, etc.
 - Establish consensus for Consortium Agreement
 - Work in parallel with MoU process
